Re: COVID-19 update

Please place in the COVID-19 binders

Good morning!

I wanted to advise you of important updates:

- Infectious Disease Emergency Leave; and
- Travel Guidance.

Infectious Disease Emergency Leave:

- Effective April 19, 2021, Part-time and Casual employees are eligible to days of paid infectious disease emergency leave under the Employment Standards Act.
- Part-time and Casual employees may take up to 3 paid days off for reasons related to COVID-19, including:
 - o going for a COVID-19 test
 - o staying home awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test
 - being sick with COVID-19
 - getting individual medical treatment for mental health reasons related to COVID-19
 - going to get vaccinated
 - o experiencing a side effect from a COVID-19 vaccination
 - having been advised to self-isolate due to COVID-19 related reasons (e.g., sick with COVID-19 or have symptoms of COVID-19; or self-isolating due to COVID-19 on the advice of a medical practitioner or other specified authority)
- The employee's immediate supervisor will review and approve eligibility for paid leave (up to 3 days).

Travel Guidance (effective June 22, 2021):

As the province reopens and summer arrives, OPTIONS recognizes that people will want to travel.

Please be mindful that COVID-19 is still with us and that different areas of the province and the country can have different levels of the virus.

Please note the following:

- Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health **strongly advises** that individuals and families only travel out of province if it is essential.
- When travelling <u>outside</u> Ontario, you **must self-isolate for 14 days** when returning to Ontario.
- When travelling <u>within</u> Ontario, you **must self-monitor for 14 days** when returning to Thunder Bay.
